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Preparing for the Feast

Where Do I Begin - In all thy getting, get an understanding

Exodus 12th Chapter

v 16- the first day and the last day is a Holy Convocation no work shall be done, only that which is required to eat.

v18 - you shall observe the Feast of Unleaven Bread in the first month from the fourteenth day of the month at evening, until the twenty-first day of the month at evening. v19 - no leavening shall be found in your house for the duration of the feast.

"Hag Sameach" - "Happy Holiday" is the greeting for the Passover holiday

Home Traditions

Preparation for Passover may begin with a full spring cleaning of the house, with special concentration on the kitchen, removing all hametz (leavening) from the house and bringing out dishes and utensils only used for Passover.

Hametz is technically the fermented mixture of various grains; it symbolically represents the remnants of the bitter Egyptian slave experience. Hametz is the symbol of oppression, since Passover is a feast of deliverance hametz is forbidden during the Passover celebration.

Preparation for Seders

- 1. Begin planning by determining if the Seder is for home, or church. If at home are you inviting guest, if at church are you the sole planner or is the Seder being planned as a group.
- 2. Determine the appropriate amount of space required for everyone to be seated during the Seder meal. Do you have the proper amount of dishes and silverware to set an ample table?
- 3. The table may be set ahead of time, so that you have ample time to sit with your guest and family.
- 4. The women of the family set up the Seder table. The Eldest male determines which Haggaddah will be used during the Seder.
- 5. Set the plates, silverware, napkins, drink, and water glasses, small bowls for salt water (either at individual places or several communal bowls) and individual smaller plates on which to eat the ritual foods.
- 6. The Haggaddah chosen should fit the needs of the household or congregation.

Planning the Seder Service

- To make the Seder meaningful, the leaders must take time to prepare. The responsibility
 may be shared if the Seder is for the temple. If the Seder is for the home, one may do it or
 it may be shared. If the Seder is being shared, the parts should be assigned ahead of
 time to encourage involvement by individuals.
- 2. Guest may bring toys, drawings, or puppets to illustrate parts of the service.
- 3. Consideration of the starting time and length of the Seder is important. How long can the children or the adults sit, talk and discuss meaningfully until dinner is served? Plan the highlights of the Seder accordingly.
- 4. Use the time the children are away from the table to enhance the adult discussions. Each participant should feel included in the Seder experience.
- 5. What time do you plan to end the Seder? Plan to end dinner in time to do the concluding service. Focus on the highlights of the conclusion of the Seder.

Seder Plate

- 1. Karpas a green leafy vegetable which is a reminder of springtime. The karpas is dipped in salted water at the beginning of the service to remind us of the tears of slavery. A time when we had no control over ourselves.
- 2. Maror bitter herbs which remind us of the pain of slavery. Horseradish is cut into pieces as well as the horseradish root is placed on the Seder plate.
- 3. Zeroah the roasted shankbone, symbol of the Passover sacrifice in the ancient temple. Should be ordered from the butcher in advance.
- 4. Charoset a mixture of fruits, nuts, grape juice, and spices, which reminds us of the mortar that the Jews used to build Egyptian pyramids.
- 5. Betzah a roasted egg, symbol of the Passover sacrifice made at the ancient Temple in Jerusalem.

Matzah

Also found on the table is enough matzah for all. Matzah shmurah, round, hard handmade matzah can be used also. The matzah is placed in a napkin or matzah cover specially made with three inside pockets. The middle matzah, the afikoman, is used as part of the conclusion of the Seder. Afikoman means dessert in Greek and is the last food eaten during the Seder.

Wine/Grape Juice

Wine or grape juice is needed for the four cups. Four cups are specified in the service because four different verbs are found in the Haggaddah to describe being freed from bondage: I am the Lord you God and I will *free you....deliver you.....redeem you.....* and take you.....to be my people.

Searching for Hametz

On the night before the first Seder many people search for hametz in their homes. Materials needed are a feather, a candle (or a flashlight), and a plastic bag. One person hides pieces of bread throughout the house that were saved specifically for this purpose. Others begin search by candle light for the last remains of the year's old harvest. Another person sweeps the area underneath the bread with the feather and scoops the hametz into a plastic bag.

As you begin the search, recite the following blessing: Blessed are you Adonai, Eternal One, who allows us to prepare for Passover.

The next morning you gather the saved hametz and burn it in the backyard. Once everything is burned, recite the following: We have knowingly removed all hametz from our home and our hearts and are ready to experience Passover freedom.

The Seder

- Halachma Anya the Bread of Our Affliction: this section invites all who are hungry to come
 and eat alongside the people of God. This can be done prior to the holiday: Give all hametz
 (leavened) foods to a food pantry, the homeless, or organizations that feed the poor.
- Ma Nishtana Why Is This Night Different? This phrase begins with four questions that note
 the distinction between Passover and all other nights of the year. Usually the youngest child
 sings the questions. These questions set the tone for the telling of the Passover story. These
 questions are designed to invite discussion.
- Avadeem Hayeenu This section illustrates that all of us would still be slaves if Christ had not died.
- Arba Banim Four different children with different interests and abilities are described in this
 section. Four types of children are highlighted to stress that all people must be taught,
 guided, and instructed in ways unique to that individual. Learning is a personal experience,
 learning about the Exodus from slavery or sin can be shaped to meet the different social,
 educational, and emotional needs of each individual. Some of the different techniques noted
 are as follows:


Arami Oved Avi - This section reveals the early history of the Jewish people and the reasons
that they moved to Egypt. This section can be enhanced by having characters with costumes
and dramatize their roles.

Preparing for the Feast (cont)

• Eser Makot - The ten plagues. This section recognizes the plagues that were rained upon the Egyptians. As the plagues are recited, a drop of grape juice or grapejuice is removed from each cup at the mention of each plague. Having giving each child or person a plague to name and the responsibility of dropping the drink from the cup can enhance this section. Discussion - what plagues do we experience today? Are they sent by God? What plagues must we rid ourselves of to experience a modern redemption?

We conclude this section with the singing of Dayyanu, the song that acknowledges that even one of Elohim's mighty acts would have been enough. In this song we express gratitude for all the acts that Elohim has performed in our lives that we might survive.

- Rabban Gamliel Haya Omer the central symbols of the seder are explained the shankbone, the matzah, the maror.
- Bchol Dor V'dor in every generation: each individual must see him/herself as having been
 personally redeemed by Elohim through the exodus experience. At this time each person
 should reflect the natural liberation from slavery, the spiritual liberation from sin.
- The concluding blessings of the seder praise Elohim and stress the hope of future redemption for all people. Eat the afikoman, open the door for the Prophet Elijah and conclude with the last glass of grape juice saying "Next Year in New Jerusalem"



The Story of Passover

To many children Pesach (Passover) is all about eating Matzah and marching. In reality it is much, much, more. Passover is a time for each of us to remember the price that Christ has paid that we might have an opportunity to be part of his royal family. In the Jewish Cultural, much reflection is done on both the deliverance of the children of Israel from Egypt and the deliverance of the Jews from the Holocaust.

All of us have been in bondage to sin at some time in our life. If we have managed to escape that bondage, it is only because of Y'shua death, burial, and resurrection. Won't you join in celebration of the Pesach "Feast of Unleaven" bread with us as we reflect on our own deliverance both natural and spiritual and look forward to our resurrection with him in his second coming.
